1. PTODM- SECONDARY AND SENIOR SECONDARY

"Every parent is a teacher and every teacher is another parent."

Parent-Teacher Open Discussion Meeting (PTODM) aids a student's life by bringing together the two most important elders with whom they have constant interaction. So, they can openly discuss the things happening at school and home and figure out how to make it better for the child to grow up in a healthier environment. In this perspective, TVMK organizes PTODM after every assessment to have collaborative undertakings in bringing up every child. Secondary and Senior Secondary- PTODM was held on 3rd August, 2024 from Grade 10 to 12 between 3:00 pm to 5:15 pm when the parents met the respective class teachers and the subject teachers, discussing on the performance, the progress and the plans. We had 94%, 87% and 92% of parent's attendance in Grade 10, 11 and 12 respectively that show the combined efforts of the parents in upbringing their wards.



2. THE EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIP TO TNAU'S RESEARCH STATION

The students of grade 6 to 8 from TVMK had the opportunity to visit the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU) at its Regional Research Station in Krishnagiri District on August 5, 2024. During the visit, students were introduced to the Horticultural college and Research Institute, which was inaugurated on April 18, 2022, at the Regional Research Station in Paiyur. The institute seeks to ensure food security and promote the commercialization of horticulture, ultimately contributing to improved living standards for the farming community. The students learned about the research initiatives and agricultural practices employed at TNAU and educational programs available at the Horticultural College and Research Institute. Students were taken on a guided tour of the research facilities, where they observed various horticultural experiments and crop management practices. Discussions were held with faculty members and researchers about ongoing projects, challenges faced by farmers, and innovative solutions to improve crop yields. Demonstrations of modern agricultural techniques and technologies, such as drip irrigation and organic farming practices, were conducted to showcase best practices in horticulture. The visit to TNAU's Regional Research Station was an enriching experience for the students, providing them with practical insights into agricultural research and education.



3. THE EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIP TO AAHAA MILK FACTORY

On August 7, 2024, students of TVMK from grades 3 to 5 set out on an educational field trip to the Aahaa Milk Factory in Sappanipatty, Krishnagiri. This outing provided students with an opportunity to gain first-hand knowledge about milk production and processing, reinforcing their classroom learning with practical observation. The visit included a comprehensive tour of various sections within the milk factory, allowing the students to engage with different stages of milk processing, namely, Milk, Collection section, Packing Section, Fresh Cream Collection Section, Panneer Section and Khoa Section. The field trip significantly contributed to the student's understanding of dairy production and processing, such as, Understanding Milk standards, Food Safety and Quality Control and Practical Knowledge of Food Production. In a nutshell, the trip to Aahaa Milk Factory was an enriching experience that complemented the students' academic learning. It provided them with practical knowledge about dairy production. It instilled a sense of curiosity and respect for food science. The insights gained from this will serve as a foundation for further explorations in nutrition and agriculture.





4. SPARK SCIENCE EXPO

Science exhibitions in schools serve as pivotal events that ignite curiosity, foster learning and promote scientific thinking among students. These exhibitions are not merely displays of project; they are platforms that encourage innovation, experimentation and the application of scientific principles in real-world scenarios. In the fulfilment of such an objective, TVMK inaugurated 'SPARK SCIENCE EXPO' on 10th, August, 2024 with the participation of 394 students from Grade 3 to 12, featuring a range of exhibits covering various branches of science such as physics, chemistry, biology, environmental science and technology and the projects including working models, demonstrations, research findings and innovative solutions to real-world problems that were witnessed, relished and were judged by Dr. Frederick Sam. J, the Senior Principal of SVVGI, our school Principal Mr. Son Robin Leon, Ms. Jigimol, the Controller of Examination, the Vijay CBSE Schools, Ms. Sundari, the Vice-Principal, TVMK and Ms.Vilma, the Vice-Principal of SVVD.
