AWARENESS AND INFORMATION CORNER

DENGUE AWARENESS:

Dengue can range from asymptomatic infection or mild illness to severe disease. An estimated 1 in 4 dengue virus infections are symptomatic. Symptomatic dengue virus infection most commonly presents as a mild to moderate, acute febrile illness. Infection with one of the four dengue viruses will induce long-lived immunity for that specific virus.



Because there are four dengue viruses, people can be infected multiple times in their life. Early clinical findings are nonspecific but require a high index of suspicion because recognizing early signs of shock and promptly initiating intensive supportive therapy can reduce risk of death among patients.

PROTECT YOURSELF, PROTECT OTHERS



Symptoms include high fever, headache, rash and muscle and joint pain. It may also cause nausea and vomiting. In severe cases there is serious bleeding and shock, which can be life threatening.
